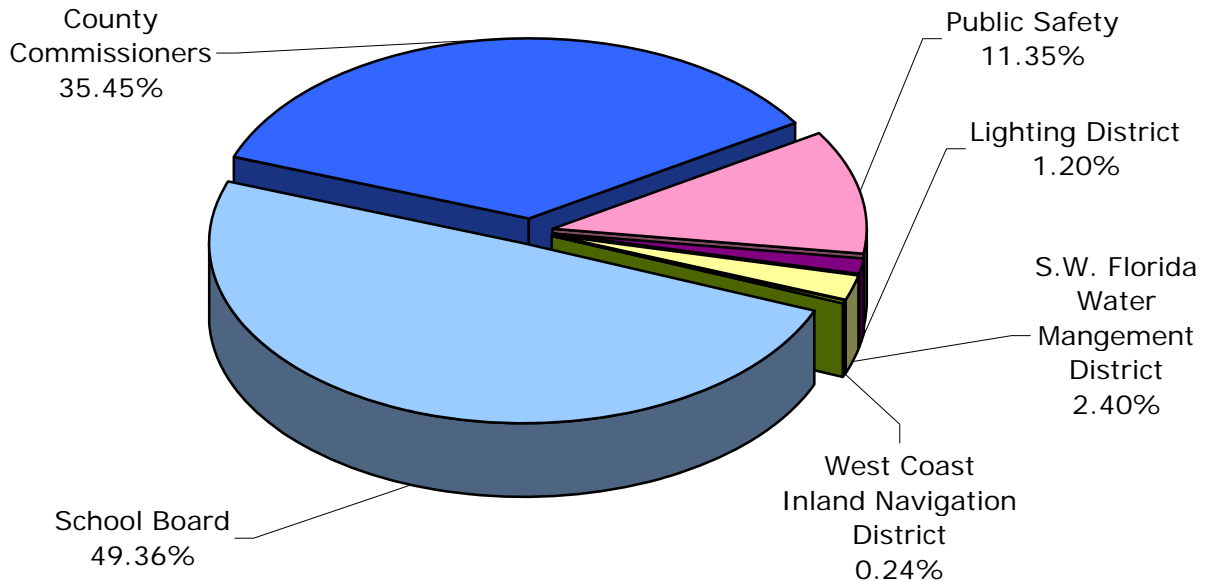


# A TYPICAL TAX BILL

## Based on a \$150,000 Assessed Valuation

### Ad Valorem Tax Levies

The above example reflects a typical tax bill for an average home with an assessed value of \$150,000, less \$25,000 for homestead exemption for the School Board and \$50,000 homestead exemption for all other taxing authorities. The tax bill is broken down by various rates that apply to the specific area in which the home is located.

The Charlotte County School Board is an independently elected body that is authorized to levy its own taxes.

The County Commissioners millage rate is the Countywide millage rate that includes the General Fund, Capital Projects Fund and the Health Department Fund. The General Fund includes all the Constitutional Officers' budgets (Sheriff, Clerk of Courts, Tax Collector, Property Appraiser, and Supervisor of Elections) and Emergency Medical Services EMS.
