With 130 acres Cedar Point is one of Charlotte County's unique environmental areas. Cedar Point is made up of pine flatwoods, mangrove fringe, salt marshes, and hammocks.

Situated on Lemon Bay, a long narrow estuary, Cedar Point is a great place to see wading birds in the mangrove fringes, watch for dolphins near the adjacent seagrasses and explore the pine flatwoods to find bald eagles, gopher tortoises, as well as a myriad of native plants.

While exploring the trails at Cedar Point, let nature provide a sense of balance, tranquility and relaxation.

The Cedar Point Environmental Center is operated by the Charlotte Harbor Environmental Center, Inc. to provide environmental education opportunities including guided nature walks, presentations and seagrass wading trips. The Center is open year round Tuesday through Saturday from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm.
